The social scene was again covered by John Tumminello and his band of helpers. The annual dinner was again a most successful night.

NSW Rugby Referee Department.

NSW referees continue to serve the NSW Rugby Union and its affiliates with a high degree of professionalism and dedication. Completing the first of our four-year strategic plan the NSW Referee department has been able to implement a number of initiatives as part of the four-year strategic plan. These include the implementation and ongoing development of the NSW Referee Website (referees.nswrugby.com.au) where appointments, news & relevant articles allow our referees and others to access important information in a fast and efficient way. Referee database that allows the department to send out appointments via e-mails, which saves time and money for the department.

Again the department worked hard at recruitment and development of potential referees having administered over 55 referee courses from level 1 Touch Judging, through to Level 3 referee assessors courses across the state. Dedicated and professional staff across the state led by Mr. Paul Heath our Referee Development Officer have been able to run courses for over 900 people across the state most of which we hope will find a career in refereeing. It must be noted that our Referee Development Officers (RDO) who worked as volunteers often travelling long distances to give courses. To all our RDOs across the 11 zones I thank you for your outstanding work in recruitment and education of referees.

The development program commenced under a new structure with the four squads each assigned a dedicated coach who was responsible for the programming of each squad during the year. These squads were made up of referees across the state that met on a number of occasions to exchange ideas and expands their knowledge on refereeing. On behalf of the union I would like to thank the coaches of the squads for their time and hard work in lifting the profile of these squads. A good deal was learnt in the first year of this format, which will help us plan, develop and streamline the process in the future.

Both the Representative and Metropolitan coaching and grading boards have once again given a great deal of their time during the season. Their continued dedication to helping referees improve through their coaching and assessing has helped maintain NSW referees at the forefront of officiating in the country. Our referees continue to gain worldwide recognition with the appointment to Super 12 and International matches. This can only be achieved through coaching and assessment programs that both the NSW referee and the ARU referee departments have continued to work towards.

A dedicated and long serving member in Robin Timmins has served NSW Rugby referees department. Robin has been the face of the referees department for over thirty years working tirelessly to keep referees informed and on the paddock week in and week out often working seven days a week during the season. I am sure all would share with me in thanking Robin for her continued support of all referees.

2000 saw Salomon Smith Barney become the official sponsor to the NSW Referees. With a vast grassroots audience the NSW referees are an attractive property for companies such as Salomon Smith Barney who have invested time and money into our organisation. We welcome Salomon Smith Barney and hope that their investment over the next few years is fruitful for both organisations. I would urge anyone who wishes to maximise their investments to contact our sponsors.

This year the referees department along with its various appointment boards appointed to just under 3000 games in the Sydney Metropolitan area. With over 260 referees used this year makes NSW referees one of the largest associations in the world. Our referees have been committed to contributing to this game over many years paying their own way because they enjoyed being part of the game. All would agree that with the onset of the open game and the demands placed upon officials each year, and as part of the strategic plan, payment for services, like many other sports, will be a natural part of this progression.

It would be amiss of me not to thank all referees for their continued support both on and off the field. Though 2000 was a shortened season, all would agree that it was an enjoyable one. To all our winners of the various awards I congratulate you for your efforts during the year. To all those who have decided not to continue refereeing in the future I would like to thank you for your efforts during the years, I hope you continue to take an interest in rugby in the future.
