President's Report 2001.

Gentleman and Ladies I present to the members of the New South Wales Referee Association the Annual Report for 2001.

Member subscriptions indicate that we have good representation in the number of members now believing it is important to be a member of the Association and this is a positive. As you would be aware since 1998 the administration of referees has been the responsibility of the Union as far as general organisation is concerned with the Association having responsibility for the "Club" activity function. However the Association still has a brief to act and be involved in a consultative role in matters concerning the general membership and on the memberships' behalf with the Union. Therefore it is considered that the flow of information between the Referee's Office and the Referees' Association needs to be strengthened.

The Referees' Office has continued to develop electronic transfer of appointments, education updates and general information and this has ensured the timely distribution of information to the members as demonstrated by the weekly appointments. The web site is also a innovation which provides information about refereeing to members and is available to the Association. This is a quantum leap forward in terms of the previous issue by mail.

It is understood that the move of the New South Wales Rugby Union to the Sydney Football Stadium has provided the Union with better office accommodation. Waratah Stadium, although a basic venue, was central and provided no problems for members as a meeting venue. I encourage members to continue to support activities at the Sydney Football Stadium as was the case with Waratah.

This year's raffle was a financial success and the profit of about \$4000 will be used to benefit members. For any future ticket selling exercise to maximise income ALL members must participate. The result this year was about 65% participation level.

A new initiative this year was for the Association to purchase and distribute to each member a Law Book financed through Association funds. Other items included \$7500 set aside for communication gear to enable coaches to listen to referee communication with teams. I understand from feedback of trials conducted that this initiative has been well received and is providing considerable benefits. The Association continued to support the monthly meetings through the provision of refreshments and for this purpose funding of \$2500 was allocated.

Other events that were organised by your Association and were well received were the interchange weekend and the annual dinner. My thanks to Ian Eastman for organising the interchanges, Ian Kennedy who was a most interesting guest and Ben Heap for his interview session.

This year following requests by members at previous Annual General Meetings included in the report are the records of achievements by referees who have been or still are members of the N.S.W. or Sydney Referees' Association. There are still some gaps to be filled and the members are asked to advise it should they know the recipient of the award.

Your Association has received many member enquiries about the issue of referee payments. The major concern here is that other codes are remunerating officials with a structure which allows benefits, tax concessions and a level of payment far in excess of the "expense" allowance currently made available to our members. It may well be the case that in order for a fair resolution of this issue that we may need to seek expert opinion on the ramifications which could involve third parties.

There are many people who contribute to the Association in one way or another and on behalf of the members I would like to thank personally each of the following.

NSW Rugby Union Referee Department.

As our game has grown and gained far more exposure across a number of fields, so to the Referees' Department has risen to meet the challenges that it has faced over the past couple of seasons. Greater numbers participating in rugby equates to more games being played.

Between District and Schools games there has been an increase of around 300 appointments in the past three years the number of games has increased by approximately 20%. This is mainly due to the extra games associated with the Kefu, Willie O' and other Polynesian cups being played at the end of the regular season.

The challenge has been to meet the growing demand with officials who are well trained and equipped to handle situations that arise both on and off the field.

We have recruited about 35 more referees in the past season though this has been offset by a small number of those dropping out. In the past three years we have recruited 110 new referees for the NSW referee association and many others for the districts associations.

There are 2,600 accredited officials across the State who are active and referee or officiate on a regular basis. The referees are appointed each weekend to officiate games at Junior, District and Senior level.

The Department held 66 courses with 450 participants during 2001. Rationalising the times and places where courses are held has reduced the number of courses over the past two years though we have found far greater numbers in the return of exams and those qualifying than in the past.

Two hundred and eleven courses have been held over the last three years with a graduate result of around 70%. This has increased due to the rationalisation of courses and the extra follow up that has occurred by our referee course co-ordinator Mr. Paul Heath. Paul has put in many hours to make sure that our database is second to none so that we can access information vital for funding and other requirements at a push of a button. My thanks goes to Paul's continued commitment and support during this year.

A strength of the department in recent times has been our ability to develop a comprehensive database and communication with over 1,000 officials, referees, referee coaches, course presenters, touch judges and others utilising our extensive e-mail system and new referee website.

This technology has enabled dissemination of information to our members and others at a far greater rate as well as easy community access to our office.

With increased numbers and a greater commitment by our officials there come challenges for all. Our members need support both on and off the field. Mrs Robin Timmins continues to meet some of the challenges of a growing and developing association. Greater pressure to release appointments to our members has been one of these chaellenges and with improved technology this medium can only get better. Thanks once again to Robin for her support and dedication to the job.

While we assist officials in such areas as reducing the cost of gear, on-field communications equipment and education nights/days to improve officiating, referee coaching is still one challenge that remains and must be addressed in the near future.

Referee coaching is vital if our officials are to progress, whether it is at suburban level or the

Premiership competition. Working with the ARU Referee Department's National Coach and the National Referee Training Officer this challenge is a strategic issue that is a high priority for 2002.

The assistance and support received from our members, the coaching and grading boards, the Referee Association, and its President, John Tumminello, enables the Department to be progressive, and innovative in the approach to officiating. The NSW Referee Department looks forward to the challenges ahead.

NSW COUNTRY REFEREES COACHING and GRADING BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT for SEASON 2001

The season 2001 was, in the main, one of "steady as she goes", with the added complication and expense of having to send referees and coaches to either end of the State. The continuation of the Australian Rugby Shield gave some of our members an opportunity at a higher level and we trust this will continue. Congratulations to Mark Eades and Tony Rudd, as referees, and Nathan Pearce as reserve referee, at the three games hosted in this competition by NSW Country. Mark was also appointed to referee the semi-final in Perth, and Tony was reserve referee at the final in Armidale. Assigning of referees to Carnivals was done on the basis that Country Week had the top referees, hence only "A" panel people went to that carnival. Continuation of the coaching of the Coaches took place, whereby CGB members were observed doing their feedback sessions, and in turn supplied with feedback to help them improve. In addition, "talent identified" coaches were used at some of the carnivals, and they were observed and given feedback accordingly. Here I particularly thank Tony Rudd, Mark Eades, Jim Scardanis and Jonno Phelps for their efforts. It is the Board's intention to pursue this approach in the coming seasons. Touch Judge coaching also was emphasised. Michael Carse took responsibility for Touch Judge education, coaching etc. We were able, due to Michael's efforts, to appoint T.J.'s on merit at Country Week, also at the other carnivals where practical.

Continuation and expansion of the RAP (Referee Advancement Program) has resulted in eight referees being given the opportunity to show their wares at an earlier stage of their careers than would have been possible under the old system. We intend to continue this trend throughout 2002, as it is becoming obvious that we are in need of developing talent for the years to come. All the RAP referees were given opportunities "in the middle" at the 14/15's Carnival at Newcastle and the performances were impressive.

The continuation of the CGB seminar again proved a very worthwhile addition to our overall approach to the job at hand, and to this end I would like to offer our very deep appreciation to NSW Rugby Referees' Department. Also I would like to thank George Ayoub for this support, and for making the time available to attend.

I would congratulate Central North zone on the excellent performance from their Touch Judges at Country Week. A disappointment during the year was the number of dropouts from Carnival appointments, which makes the job of assigning referees to carnivals are more difficult chore than it should be – it also makes the Registrar's life miserable, with accommodation etc constantly being revised. To this end I thank Peter Charker for his patience and good work in this area. There was a total of seven withdrawals from carnivals made after the appointments had been announced.

It is with regret that the retirement from Country refereeing of Mark Eades has been advised. Mark was, without doubt, one of our best performing referees, having handled five finals, numerous other rep appointments, and a successful stint in Sydney. I have no doubt Mark will continue in various roles in refereeing, hopefully again at Country level some time in the future. Also, Ian Richardson has announced his retirement – Ian too has a long and impressive record with Country and NSW, and we hope to see him in another role with Country referees in the near future. Well done Ian and Mark.

Finally, I would like to thank the members of the CGB for their enthusiasm and support for 2001, and whilst I prefer not to single out individuals, the support from Bruce Cook and Austin Rummery was, as ever, outstanding.
