President's Report 2002.

Gentleman and Ladies I present to the members of the New South Wales Referee Association the Annual Report for 2002.

The general membership has increased over that of 2001 with 210 referees paying their subscription for 2002. The Association continued with its role as a consultative body in matters concerning the general membership and has continued to act on the memberships' behalf with the Union.

The Referees' Office has continued with electronic communication to our membership, which has proved beneficial in having all members notified of what is happening quickly. This also facilitates communication with all those members who for one reason or another cannot attend scheduled meetings.

I would like to draw to members attention that failure to attend meetings in 2003 will have an effect on their continued accreditation and every member must now take control of their own accreditation through completing the requirements as set out in Rugby Office documentation

The response to the years Annual Dinner was greater than anticipated and one of the best in recent times. Rod Macqueen was an excellent speaker giving us all a unique insight into the top coaching job, his development into that job as well as some of the less publicised events in relation to the Wallaby team. Our thanks also to Phil Wilkins who acted as M.C. following on from Paul Heath who had done this for the previous three dinners. Your committee approved of the small subsidy to this event to ensure that as many members as possible could attend.

The records of achievements by referees who have been or still are members of the N.S.W. or Sydney Referees' Association have again been included in this document. There are still gaps to be filled and the members are asked to advise should they know the recipient of the award.

Your Association spent considerable time and expense in meetings and in preparation of documentation about the issue of referee payments. During the year we received some conflicting information from the Rugby administration. Even so we were confident that the Rugby administration had adopted in principle the view that the general body of referees should be better compensated, as occurs in other sports, for the time spent particularly as expectation had increased. The referees and touch judges appointed to Tooheys Cup matches are now compensated and this raised the expectation that this would flow down in 2003 but this has not happened. In response to a motion from a meeting of referees in December the N.S.W. Rugby Executive Director has been requested to advise on the position for 2004. A response to this request has been sought for distribution at the Annual General Meeting.

This year the committee agreed to my nominating for a position on the N.S.W Rugby Board to give the referee discipline a voice at that level. It was thought that at this time it would not be successful, but would show an interest in the development of Rugby. We were most disappointed to find that an existing member of that Board actively sought to denigrate the position of referees by canvassing attendees to not vote for the representation. It is hoped that any future nomination is not viewed in this manner.

Many people contribute to the Association in one way or another and on behalf of the members I would like to thank personally each of the following.

2002 has been by far our busiest and longest season for some time. There have been some highs and lows throughout the officiating fraternity with many no doubt happy to be enjoying a break.

This season again saw out top match officials appointed to test matches both in the Southern Hemisphere as well as games in the Northern Hemisphere. Stuart Dickinson, Peter Marshall and Wayne Erickson flew the N.S.W. flag with appointments at Test level while Matthew Goddard was appointed to his first Rugby Super 12 match in South Africa and also attended the Under 21 tournament in the same country. Our Referee Coaches were well represented with Brian Kinsey and Sandy Macneill both appointed to assess games at the International level.

At the local level many of our up and coming referees were given opportunities to show their skills in the main competitions as well as the many championships that were held across the country. In total we had 15 match officials represented at these championships including the Australian Rugby Shield. Our Referee coaches are also being selected at these tournaments to assist our match officials while gaining skills that are necessary in the field of referee coaching.

Three of our officials have been selected for the Level 3 course in 2003. Mr. Roger Higgins (Referee Coach), Mr. Nathan Pearce, & Mr. James Scholtens (Match Officials). Congratulations on being chosen for this.

All this could not be achieved without the behind the scene service provided by our full-time and volunteer staff. Both Robin Timmins and Paul Heath continue to work tirelessly to assist all match officials seven days a week. I am sure I can say on behalf of all officials a big thanks for your great efforts. To our Coaching Boards and the chairmen of these Boards Mr. Brian Kinsey & Mr. Cliff Dodds your leadership has allowed all our match officials an opportunity to enjoy and develop their skills at whatever level they are officiating.

Our Referee Association continues to provide N.S.W. Referees a service that is very much appreciated. Mr. John Tuminello and his committee have worked tirelessly for the interests of all officials. I am sure all match officials are appreciative of your time and work.

Our sponsor Trendwest has been a tremendous asset for our match officials this year. The team from Trendwest have worked tirelessly to promote officiating and their product throughout the season. To Debbie Manuel and Jim Sabot we thank you for your continued support and we look forward many years of association.

On a very sad note we witnessed a number of very unfortunate and sad events across the State. The tragic death of a player playing in a grand final on the Mid North Coast as well as some very serious injuries sustained this year to players. Our match officials have acted professionally in all matters associated with this and I would like to thank them for their assistance throughout the year.

On a brighter note there have been a number of initiatives that we were able to achieve during the 2002 season.

1. Completion of the Referee Department Operational Manual.
2. Further development and use of the N.S.W. Referee Website & the Referee Coach website that has allowed referee coaches access to reports on all match officials.
3. Our recruitment and development of our young match officials continues to reap rewards. 70% of our Grand final match Officials have come from our development squads in the past two to three years.
4. The first joint seminar for all our referee coaches was held at the start of the year to forge a common coaching style across the State.
5. The Tooheys New Cup has allowed our match officials to show their skills at another level and exposed them to a better standard of game.
6. The introduction of a two-way system of communication for our match officials at the top end.

Again this could not all be achieved without the assistance of all our volunteer staff who continue to work for the betterment of all involved in officiating our game. Great strides have been made this past season which can only benefit our match officials and coaches as well as the game of Rugby. We cannot rest on our laurels but find new and better ways to lift the standard of officiating.

**NSW RUGBY REFEREES REPRESENTATIVE COACHING AND GRADING
BOARD CHAIRMAN'S REPORT SEASON 2002.**

This was a challenging season with a new format of competition and some guidelines set down by NSWRU that did not allow a great amount of room for flexibility in appointing for the Tooheys New Cup.

The format of the finals series also provided challenges for the Board to give the same number of opportunities as in previous seasons.

Congratulations to all referees for their excellent efforts during the season and in particular to Stuart Dickinson on his initial premier grade grand final appointment.

The Shute Shield competition gave opportunities to many referees to gain first grade experience and we congratulate James Leckie and Adam Taylor on their initial appointments to the senior grade.

At the conclusion of the season we commenced what will become an annual event whereby the Chairman of the Board and the individual referees coach conducted an interview of the season in review and goals, strategies, and expectations for the coming season with each member of the top 30 referees other than those members of the National Squad. These discussions were very well received by those involved and provided a platform for planning the individuals and Board future development.

Coaching reports were prepared when referees were seen by members of the Board throughout the season with the exception of the Tooheys New Cup when every second game was assessed under the IRB guidelines as a requirement from NSW Rugby Union. Next year these assessments will be done in a different manner as we now have a criteria set up from a National level for use domestically. This will relieve the Board members of a most time consuming chore and will give the referees enough information on their performances to allow for more coaching.

The Board met regularly during the season and my thanks go to the members for their efforts during what appears to be getting a longer and longer Rugby season.

NSW COUNTRY REFEREES COACHING and GRADING BOARD
CHAIRMAN'S REPORT for SEASON 2002

The season 2002 started out to be one of great promise – the concept of games being played in the zones for the under 20's, instead of a carnival, led us to expect an opportunity to try more referees at a better level, and give them more game time also. Unfortunately, the expectation was not realized, since zones did not fulfil their obligations, some withdrew altogether, fixtures were advised far too late, and then quite often were changed several times. This meant that the apparent positive turned into an organizational nightmare for us. I would like to thank the referees and coaches involved for their tolerance, and Peter Charker who nearly had a breakdown.

The continuation of the Australian Rugby Shield gave some of our members an opportunity at a higher level and we trust this will continue. Congratulations to Tony Rudd and Nathan Pearce, and to Matt Blackham and Andrew Lees as reserve referees in the three games hosted in this competition by NSW Country. The assessment process used, however, was unsatisfactory, and I feel that our two did not get a fair shot at the finals series because of its shortcomings. I have reported my observations to NSW and the Australian selectors.

Assigning of referees to Carnivals was done on the basis that, as Country Week and Country schools were run simultaneously, we could bring all ten referees into Gosford, and the schools' referees commuted to Sydney. This gave us the opportunity to apply some development aspects, such that rotation between both carnivals meant that some developing referees were given a chance at the higher level. The selection of referees for the two carnivals therefore had a significant development component and gave the board, who were present in full, to see some previously unseen referees. This resulted in, I know, some disappointments with some people who felt that, because they had not been selected, they had been "downgraded". As explained above, this was NOT the case.

Continuation of the coaching of the Coaches took place, whereby CGB members were observed doing their feedback sessions, and in turn supplied with feedback to help them improve. This year, resulting from a recommendation put to last year's CGB seminar by a leading member of the referees' panel, I as chairman did "one-on-one" sessions with the referees after they had received their coaching feedback. This meant that even better information was available to assist with the "coach-the-coach" work. Touch Judge coaching also was emphasised. Michael Carse took responsibility for Touch Judge education, coaching etc. We were able, due to Michael's efforts, to appoint T.J.'s on merit at Country Week, also at the other carnivals where practical.

Continuation and expansion of the RAP (Referee Advancement Program) has resulted in a number of referees being given the opportunity to show their wares at an earlier stage of their careers than would have been possible under the old system. We intend to continue this trend throughout 2003, as it is becoming obvious that we are in need of developing talent for the years to come. All the RAP referees were given opportunities "in the middle" at the 14/15's Carnival and also at other rep games as and when appropriate. The

performances were impressive.

The continuation of the CGB seminar again proved a very worthwhile addition to our overall approach to the job at hand, and to this end I would like to offer our very deep appreciation to NSW Rugby Referees' Department. Also I would like to thank George Ayoub for this support.

I would congratulate Central Coast zone on the excellent performance from their Touch Judges at Country Week. Country Juniors kept us in the loop for the whole season which gave significantly more opportunities to all levels, but especially those in development. This meant significantly more logistical work than in previous years, and to this end I thank Peter Charker for his patience and good work in this area.

It is with regret that the retirement from Country referee coaching of Bruce Cook took place, due of course to his wonderful achievement in obtaining his position with the IRB in Dublin. Bruce was, without doubt, one of our best referee coaches, and was also a tower of strength as a selector. Bruce's input to CGB seminars will also be sorely missed.

It is also with regret that the retirement from Country refereeing of Tony Rudd has been advised. Tony was, without doubt, one of our best performing referees over many carnivals and other representative appointments, capped by his handling of the final this year. I have no doubt Tony will continue in various roles in refereeing, hopefully again at Country level some time in the future.

Also, Ian Richardson, Gordon Magann and David Sloane were appointed to the CGB this year, and all three immediately "slotted in" and were soon out there doing good coaching work.

Finally, I would like to thank the members of the CGB for their enthusiasm and support for 2002, and whilst I prefer not to single out individuals, the support from Austin Rummery was, as ever, outstanding.

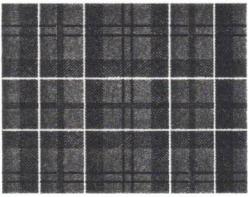
