Many of these are recorded elsewhere in this Annual Report. Special mention to Angus Gardner, who refereed his first Shute Shield Grand Final.

Off the field, we celebrated the wonderful contribution to NSW refereeing from Norm Stevens, who announced his retirement from "active duty". We wish Norm and Margery all the very best and look forward to catching up at social events and at the footy. Ian Pascoe also hung up the boots and clipboard after many years of fine contribution.

Our matriarch (I'll get into trouble for that one), the one and only Robin Timmins, received much deserved recognition for her many years of ensuring the wheels of NSW refereeing continue to turn. Robin was awarded Life Membership of the NSWRU, an OAM, and an IRB Award in recognition of her service to the game. Sincere congratulations and thanks, Robin! Andrew Cole and Wayne Erickson were recently appointed as IRB Selectors for Mens' and Womens' 15-a-side Rugby respectively. Whilst this is probably an achievement for Australian Refereeing from national perspective, it is extremely important for us within NSW. Congratulations to both these gents.



We participated in an Interchange with Canterbury RRA (NZ), with Brendon Farrar as our representative in Christchurch. Brendon represented us with aplomb, and gained much experience in the process. Unfortunately, the same cannot be said for the Canterbury referee, Spencer Tait. Poor Spencer strained his hamstring 5 minutes into his first game in Sydney and was forced to return home. Special thanks to Buddy Kyle and Blair York for providing accommodation for Spencer during his albeit truncated time in Sydney.

Special thanks also go to Andrew Halmarick, who as a Director of Craig & Rhodes, provided training shirts for all active referees. This was a magnificent and generous gesture from Andrew and his company, for which we are extremely grateful.

The social side of life comprised of several informal get togethers, and culminated in another outstanding Annual Dinner and Awards Evening, held this year at the impressive Royal Sydney Yacht Squadron at Kirribilli. It was a venue befitting the status and history of our Association. The dinner proved to be a great opportunity to relax and reflect on another busy year. It was encouraging to see so many younger referees present, along with many partners who provide such great support to us, and of course, our Life Members who have contributed so much over a long period of time.

Whilst on the subject of the Annual Dinner, we were delighted to host the Executive Director of NSWRU, Mr Bruce Worboys; Chairman of NSWRU, Mr Nick Farr-Jones; and Director of SRU, Mr Chris Birch. Their collective wisdom and experience are invaluable to the referees who benefit from their guidance and advice. It is crucial for a group such as this to be free of personal agendas, and I am delighted to say that they maintain the continued improvement of referees as their primary focus. Michael Tanzer has chaired this group extremely well. Michael's input has been in this forum, as well as via the NSWRU Referee Management Committee, which consisted of Michael, Peter Marshall, Wayne Erickson and I. Decisions made by this group are largely implemented by Ron Mancell, who with Alex Richards, continue to put in long hours in ensuring the smooth running of the nuts and bolts of refereeing in NSW. Our thanks to Ron and Alex.

Finally, I wish to express my sincere thanks to my diligent and highly competent Executive team. Secretary Ed Martin, Treasurer Phil Baird and General Member Tim Wills have worked extremely hard in ensuring their respective roles are carried out effectively and punctually. Their efforts have led to outcomes such as the well received Association Newsletter, successful social events, and a healthy financial position.

# NSW RUGBY REFEREE DEPARTMENT REPORT

The department again provided referee education and development in the form of courses, education nights and seminars for the association.

Our development programs for referees continued in 2013. Whilst the long standing development groups continue to function in their well-trodden ways, the ongoing success of the SRIP and MRIP and the enthusiasm of these squad members continued to be a highlight of our development program. We have decided to increase the number of referees in the MRIP to provide more education and development opportunities for more referees. Thanks goes to the Squad Leaders for their commitment to leading these development groups.

There are a number of development activities (tournaments or matches) which continued in 2013 to contribute to individual referee development. The CHS carnival and the Gold Coast Schoolboy Carnival are two which highlight the opportunities for our emerging referees. These will continue in the new-year with the CHS Carnival being held on the South Coast in 2014.

We successfully supported the Lavengamalie Church in Tonga with referees for their biennial tournament. Ten referees represented NSWRRA over the Nov 2013 – Jan 2014 period. This event is to be conducted again in 2015 in Tonga.

A substantial number of referees from NSWRRA also represented the association at the Central Coast Sevens and Darwin's Hottest Sevens. Sevens and events such as the Lavengamalie will be used as major development activities into the future.

The 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Premier Coaches and 1<sup>st</sup> Grade Referees met before the season commenced and discussed how the game was to be played and refereed in 2013. The same can be said for Sydney Suburban as we conducted a series of seminars for them and closed the loop on a fairly successful "adopt a referee program".

2013 saw the introduction of the Respect Rugby program in response to the previous year's poor record of referee abuse. The success of the program was varied. In Suburban Rugby, CAS and ISA, Sydney Juniors and some Country Zones, the program was fully embraced and generally there was a great improvement in the week to week experiences of our referees. Unfortunately, in other areas of community rugby, the experience was not as positive.

We will continue to work with all stake holders in community rugby to improve this aspect of the game for all participants.

The NSWRU Referees Department would like to thank VOLVO for their support of Premier Rugby in 2013 and we look forward to their support in years to come.

We would also like to acknowledge the support of the NSWRRA Executive, the Referee Coaching Panel and all referees who participated in 2013.

# REFEREES MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

2013 saw the continuation of the road to self discovery as a prime motivation in referee coaching. As a group we all strived to be the best we could be on and off the field. The implementation of the Game/Plan/Review process from the previous year and consolidation of this model across all levels of rugby refereeing saw great strides forward in performance and a more solid understanding and consistency in coaching referees. The key aspects of emphasis in reviewing games were around the empathy the referee has for the game, their ability to then change player behaviour as required in a tactically astute manner and then being technically proficient or accurate in their decision making. This process in coaching referees is unashamedly proactive in NSW in implementing the ARU's and SANZAR's vision of best practice in referee coaching. It is important for NSW to maintain its prominence in being on song and leading with these groups to advance not only refereeing in NSW but also Australia.

To this end it is pleasing to revel in the successes of some of our association at the representative level. Steve Walsh continues to lead Australian referees with appointments in The British Lions Tour, The Rugby Championship, November Northern Hemisphere tests, Six Nations and Super Rugby Finals. We wish Steve well for the future as he now resides in the very appropriately named Sunshine Coast. Angus Gardner refereed Japan v Tonga, Super Rugby and the Sydney First grade Grand final. Andrew Lees attended the Junior World Cup Tournament in France and also refereed Super Rugby as did James Leckie. Anthony Moyes and Amy Perrett continued to represent us at several iRB Sevens tournaments each doing finals in Tokyo and Dubai. Ian Smith, Ed Martin, Will Houston, Richard Goswell and Michael Hogan all were involved in Super Rugby as assistants and most refereed Schools tests. The representative honours of the association are spread across these 11 members and does not include numerous selections at national carnivals and Sevens tournaments by many more. It does indicate the success of the development programs and the depth of the successes should be shared by all in the association. We look forward to bigger things ahead.
