PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2016 was very much a year of 'changing of the guard', with new faces taking up positions as President of the Association, Head of the Management Committee, NSW Referee manager and of course Luke Rogan replacing Robin Timmins as the Appointments officer. I would personally like to thank you all for having the faith in me to lead this great association.

With any change comes opportunity and I am excited to be at the helm as we try to move the association forward, to be the best that it can be. In light of this I think it is appropriate to communicate to you all, where I would like to take the association in my time as your President, as well as clarifying the role and responsibilities of the association.

Vision

To make the SRRA the number one referee association in Australia in terms of engagement, enjoyment and performance.

We aim to be an inclusive and equitable association that values its members and actively enables and celebrates the contribution of its members in this pursuit.

Role of the Association

In NSW we are extremely lucky to have the financial contribution of our home union to refereeing in the form of the NSWRU Referees department. The department takes a significant level of burden away from the association in regards to the provision of education and training, coaching and the allocation of on field uniforms, whilst also handling the distribution of appointments.

So what is the primary role of the association then? The simple answer is that the association is here for you, our members. Your executive act as your representatives and collective voice to the union, whilst also trying to enhance the overall referee experience, via the arrangement of off field social functions such as the Pub of the Month, the Annual Dinner and the June Test Referee functions we have held these past few years. For want of a better phrase we are the 'referee club', and it is our role to bring you all together as often as possible and to make you feel part of something bigger. Our goal is to create a welcoming environment, where people of all shapes, sizes, genders, and abilities are welcomed and treated equal. In addition, your association is here to support you through any personal challenges you may face, as well as with any issues unfortunately arising as a result of your involvement in refereeing.

Website and Social Media

The first step to achieving the vision outlined above was to increase the level of communication from the association to our membership, as well as the way in which we reached our members. In light of this we have created a new website for the association, as well as a Facebook page to expand our social media reach. NSW RUGBY REFEREE DEPARTMENT REPORT

2016 has been a year of transition. Robin Timmins OAM retired as Referee Assistant after 48 years of service to NSW Rugby Union and Sydney Rugby Union, not to mention her time as a referee and office bearer with Eastwood District Rugby Union Referees Association. She can still be seen (and heard) on the sideline of Eastwood games cheering on her 'Woodies'.

Robin's departure was followed shortly thereafter by Ron Mancell moving on from the Referee Manager role (which he held for 12 years, having been the Community Rugby Referee Coordinator prior to that). He remains with NSW Rugby and refereeing in a part time role as the Country Referee Development Officer (and is now the premier referee on the lower Mid North Coast).

It was intended that a replacement Referee Manager be appointed with co-funding from ACTRU and the ARU, as part of the national Match Official strategy. Unfortunately the funding for that fell through late in the season as the ARU entered stormy financial seas (again), and the position is unfilled. Consequently I have acted in the role since the beginning of March as well as continuing in my role of Referee Education Coordinator. Thanks to all the people who have helped to ease the burden, particularly Michael Doyle (NSWRU Manager – Pathways and Education) for his moral and other support.

We welcomed Amy Perrett at the start of the season in a Referee Development role, where she has been particularly focused on female referee recruitment, development of a NSW 7s program, and assistance with the roll-out of education courses and continuing education. This is a 50% ARU funded role, as she also spends much of her time refereeing on the international and national stages.

Luke Rogan took over appointments from Robin Timmins at the end of Feb and has picked up some additional responsibilities, such as send-off report proof-checking. We are looking for him to be more involved in managing referee fitness in 2017 to take advantage of his physical movement background in trying to prevent injuries. He also did all the junior appointments for the last 6 weeks of their season after Scott Rogan moved on from that role.

The ARU implemented a new Rugby Learning Centre (to replace the previous hodge-podge of exam, course registration and accreditation systems) at the start of 2016. This system is a considerable improvement, but much time has been spent learning how to use it to best effect. At the same time, RugbyLink took over from MyRugby as the registration system. As well as assisting the ARU to roll these out, we have assisted with the creation of two new online courses – Assistant Referee Kids Rugby and Viva 7s Referee. Work is ongoing to create a 7s variant of the Refereeing Kids Rugby course so that this can be used to induct new 7s referees off the street.

We have spent much of 2016 exploring the governance arrangements around how NSWRU, NSWRRA and the Management Committee interact to appoint referees. With the change in NSW Rugby Executive Officer, NSWRRA President, Referee Manager and Referee Management Committee Chairperson all occurring at around the same time there was a lot of corporate knowledge that had to be transferred. Hopefully the changes implemented for 2017 will lead to greater transparency, and will continue to be refined.

There was no change to development program structures or events in 2016, although these are being reviewed and may change for 2017 (or 2018). Certainly the ARU intends to change its development and talent ID structures in 2017 and we'll see what effect that has on NSW.



The existing programs are fulfilling their aims of retaining and developing our pipeline of young referees through to 2nd grade standard (B grade), but we want to be see if it can be done better.

We did put an emphasis on creating three panels of referees (NSW, potential and school) to handle NSW 7s events, along with a panel of referee coaches. We believe that by identifying referees and referee coaches who fit the 7s referee profile and giving them more attention that we will raise the standard of 7s refereeing in NSW and achieve selection at national and international level. With the funding assistance of Newcastle referees and NSWRRA a referee (James Quinn) and referee coach (Lauren Kelly) were sent to the Dubai 7s to participate in the amateur tournament. They performed very well and the intent is that they can share that experience with other members of the 7s program to build capacity. Amy has been active in sharing clips on a NSW 7s Facebook page to get our referees out of 15s thinking into 7s thinking (they are not the same). Most people who put their hand up for the panels have been involved in some way (a lot of tournaments to cover!) and we have a better handle on who our talented 7s referees are now and what education we need to give them at the transition from 15s to 7s.

With two referee coaches retiring or moving at the end of 2015 and no additions, there were less referee coaches to see everyone. Despite this we achieved the aim of seeing every referee in Group H or above at least twice during the season. There were a number of referees in Group I or below who were seen only once or not at all and we aim to rectify this in 2017. Some of this was due to non-availability or changes to fixtures after appointments were done. We should have some new referee coaches joining the team in 2017 which will assist with this, along with changing the expectation to seeing all referees at least once in their first 5 games and twice during the season (if they do 10 games).

Funding remains an ongoing issue, with no jersey sponsor for 2016, and ARU funding to NSWRU diminishing every year. We aim to maintain the same level of service to referees without increasing the budget in 2017, as we achieved in 2016. We acknowledge the support of Gilbert, who again provided our referee kit and sponsor NSW Rugby Union.

As well as a pre-season meeting with the Subbies and Premier coaches before the season, we instituted a mid-season meeting with the Premier coaches. This was a great opportunity for referees and coaches to get on the same page and some valuable feedback was taken from this. The number of Respect Rugby incident reports fell again this year and hopefully continued emphasis on prevention and reporting incidents sees this continue to fall.

We would like to acknowledge the efforts of all referees and referee coaches who officiated during 2016. A special thankyou to Peter Marshall (Premier Appointments), Ian Fraser (Subbies Appointments), the Referee Management Committee (Daniel Cheever, John McCarthy, Ian Smith and Michael Tanzer), Russell Trotter and Cliff Dodds (Coach the Coach), Development Squad coaches (Scott Rogan, Phil Baird, John Goh, Ian Mooney, Anthony Rydon and David Munnoch), Finals Group Coordinators (Roger Higgins, Phil Baird, David Chapman, Ian Pascoe), and the NSWRRA executive.

2016 was a memorable year as rugby returned to the Olympics and we witnessed a fantastic Shute Shield season which was capped off with an unforgettable Grand Final. Fiji and Australia were worthy Olympic Gold Medallists in the respective men's and women's events and congratulations to Norths on their Shute Shield premiership.

For our elite referees, there were once again a number of significant highlights:

- Angus Gardner cemented his position as Australia's No 1 referee with his first Six Nations & Rugby Championship appointments.
- Amy Perrett continued her trailblazing achievements as the first female referee to be appointed as an Assistant Referee in a Super Rugby match. She was also selected for the Olympics, the highlight of international rugby in 2016.
- Anthony Moyes capped off his Sevens career with his appointment to the Olympics. Anthony and Amy were the envy of all our referees.
- Will Houston enjoyed his debut season as a Super Rugby referee.
- Andrew Lees should also be congratulated on his super rugby achievements over the last 5 years.

We experienced a great Shute Shield season due to the evenness of the First Grade teams. Our referees facilitated some fantastic contests and it was fitting that a huge crowd was there to see Norths win their first premiership in many decades. Will Houston was appointed to the First Grade Grand Final for the 2nd consecutive year and made a valuable contribution to the occasion.

Matt Kellahan was recognised as the Shute Shield Referee of the Year by winning the Dick Byres Medal. This was a remarkable achievement given that 2016 was Matt's first full season in First Grade. Greg Johnstone made his First Grade debut in Round 1.

The Association put on anther enjoyable Annual Dinner in what has become the highlight of the referee social calendar. Congratulations to the 2016 Award Winners & those referees who celebrated significant milestones.

A number of our newer referees showed a lot of potential with strong performances in the lower grades and Subbies Rugby. For many reasons I believe that there is a fantastic opportunity for our next generation of referees. I look forward to seeing their progress in the coming seasons.

Subbies Rugby continues to be a vital component of the rugby landscape in Sydney. Many of the game's biggest fans are those that play and referee in this competition. The rugby is largely incident free due to the spirit of the clubs and the fantastic job that our referees do each and every weekend. We acknowledge that Subbies Rugby is going through a period of transformation as they implement their commitment to an amateur status.

I would like to thank all our referee coaches for the amount of time and effort they put in year in and year out in assisting referees to improve their refereeing performances. I continue to appreciate the feedback from the referee coaches on referee performance, their

Robin will be sorely missed and we thank her for her amazing contribution. Peter Marshall and Ian Fraser provide significant support to the Management Committee for the weekly appointments process. Their knowledge and skills enable a very efficient process to appoint over 150 referees each weekend.

Finally I would like to thank the members of the Referees Management Committee – John McCarthy, Ian Smith and Mick Tanzer for the time and effort that they put in throughout the year. There were several times during the year that I called upon the Committee to meet at short notice and everyone did their best to accommodate these requests.

2016 was my first year as Chairman. This year we focused on improving our governance and policies. Several referees and referee coaches acknowledged the importance of our new finals policy document. We initiated a program and the end of 2015 to provide end of year feedback to our top 20 referees and we refined and improved this in 2016. I hope that this can be become a template for feedback for more of our referees. In 2017 I believe our focus should to increase the transparency of the role of the Management Committee by sharing its vision and philosophy.

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Association is not a reporting entity as defined in Statement of Accounting Concepts SAC 1, Definition of the Reporting Entity, and therefore is not required to prepare financial statements in accordance with Statements of Accounting Concepts and Accounting Standards.
