PRESIDENT'S REPORT

2018 was yet another busy and successful year for the Association both on and off the field. On the field we seemed to have highlights at every turn with the most competitive Shute Shield season in recent history (including a number of referee debutants), and the suburban rugby competition going from strength to strength. The womens game continues to grow in both popularity and participation and as always the schools competition remains extremely competitive. Without doubt from a community perspective 2018 was another very successful year.

Off Field

Off the field the hard work continued, as we look to develop a culture of inclusiveness and family that is the NSWRRA way. As the largest association in Sydney, I believe it is integral that we lead by example and provide an inclusive environment where everyone is welcomed and valued, as we strive for the betterment of refereeing across the city. This ethos was continued this year by including all referees within NSW on the invite list for any and all social functions held, as well as by leading the movement to create three separate training sessions at various locations across Sydney each week.

The Rugby Championship created another opportunity for our wider membership to get up close and personal with some of the world's best referees, as we hosted the incoming referees for the Bledisloe Cup. Once again, Easts Rugby Club were kind enough to host and the night was well attended. Thank you to Scott Young of RugbyAU for his assistance in arranging access to the world's best referees.

The final event on the social calendar came with the Annual Presentation and Awards evening, held at the magnificent Four Seasons Hotel. I think all will agree that the change in venue was warranted with the amazing food, wine and company making for a very special night for all in attendance. We were lucky to be joined by a number of our life members, as well as the wider membership, to celebrate another successful year of refereeing within Sydney. Furthermore, it was so pleasing to see so many partners in attendance at this year's function, the support and understanding of our endeavours from our better halves is important to recognise, and without it we wouldn't be the Association we are. Thank you to all who came to celebrate the season that was and congratulations to all award winners.

NSWRU

2018 saw the NSWRU implement the new structures agreed to in 2017. Once again I was fortunate enough to be able to represent referees across the state within this new structure. Following the removal of Penrith from the Shute Shield, a working committee including representatives from all the rugby affiliates was put together to discuss the future direction of rugby in NSW. This collaborative 'whole of game' approach was well received by all parties and has already produced one initiative, which will assist in the long-term success of our game. 2019 will see the introduction of a Premiership under 18s competition as an extension to the current colts offering. Teams will accrue Premier Rugby Club Championship points and as such form a vital part of the Premier Rugby competition serviced by the NSWRRA.



National Conference

I was fortunate enough to attend the second National Referees Conference held in Melbourne during the Irish test series. This fantastic initiative from the ARU allows the Presidents from around the country to get together in a room and share knowledge, whilst also working to assist the ARU with the key issues each association is experiencing. Hearing from the other associations, it made me so proud to be representing you all, and for the special things we have within our team. I thank the ARU for their kind hospitality and commitment to refereeing across the country.

Match Payments

2019 saw referee payments increase for the first time in a significant period, whilst also seeing the introduction of payments to all referees appointed to assistant referee. I understand that some of the Association membership believes these rates have not moved far enough, but in light of the current financial climate of our governing body I feel it is both reckless and irresponsible for us to push further at this time. It is vital that we form a strong part of the solution to ensuring the long-term success and viability of our great game.

Sponsorship and Training Shirts

Following on from the new shirts arranged for the 2018 season I am pleased to advise the Craig & Rhodes have very kindly agreed to fund the production of new training tops for the coming 2019 season.

We continue to look for jersey sponsorship for the available spaces and front of jersey from the expiry of our current agreement.

Training

2018 saw the first change to training in a number of years. With the geographical split of referees across Sydney and the falling attendance numbers at referee training it was thought by the four associations that change was required. As such the four referee associations within Sydney made the decision to fund an additional two training sessions across Sydney a week. This will make training more accessible to the wider referee community, whilst also working to bring the broader referee community together. I am pleased to advise that this initiative will continue into 2019.

Referee Abuse

Pleasingly 2018 saw the introduction of the inclusion of myself in the distribution of all respect rugby reports submitted by our membership. This allows me to carry out my role in ensuring all incidents are handled appropriately and in a timely matter, whilst also allowing me to ensure that the people experiencing these incidents are ok. I applaud NSWRU for this initiative and look forward to continuing to work with them moving forward to further reduce the level of abuse and incidents within the rugby environment.



On Field

As seems to be the case every year the seasons seem to be getting longer and longer. As a body made up entirely of volunteers, you should all be very proud of the efforts you've all gone to this season. The number of games and tournaments which have gone ahead thanks to our referees continues to grow each year, and our membership continues to service the needs of our game in a professional manner and to a high standard. NSWRU REFEREE DEPARTMENT REPORT

In 2018 the Referee Department maintained the focus on increasing the number of referee coaches we have and using them more effectively. The aim being to see every referee twice per year at a minimum. We welcomed three new referee coaches this year – Col Dagger, John Peacocke and Phil Tout. According to the Rugby AU annual referee survey 76% of you were coached at least twice, although Sideline reports/GPRs say it was only 58%. Both of these figures are higher than the state average but there is more work to be done in 2019. One of the things that makes it difficult to achieve this aim is referees dropping out after a coach is appointed to see them. Please ensure that you keep your unavailability up to date in RAS and if you know you need to be coached be proactive in offering solutions to the appointments officer so that we can make that happen.

Many referees opted into membership of a coaching group, with 126 referees having an assigned referee coach. The number of Individual Season Plans submitted increased from 2017, although 44% of referees with an assigned coach still didn't complete an ISP. Feedback from the Referee Coach 360 survey was generally positive. Our coaches are generally seen as very approachable, but still have work to do on their development orientation. The Referee Coach Panel met for 3.5 hours in October to discuss how we could improve our activities in 2019 and plans were developed in the areas of culture, valuing everyone and coaching group organisation in order to make what we do even better.

The proportion of NSWRRA members who disagree the development pathway is fair and transparent continued to fall, from 45% in 2016 to 36% in 2017 and now 23% in 2018. This is just above the state average of 20% but shows that we are heading in the right direction. This was further improved when Rugby AU released their new Development programs in December, with 18 NSWRRA members included. These development programs widen the scope of Rugby AU involvement from just talent ID of future Super Rugby referees to also recognising referees around Australia with the ability to referee 1st Grade and with potential to further develop their refereeing. It was very pleasing that Mike Hobson (Referee Coach) and Tom Nicholl (Referee) were selected for the Rugby AU U16 Championships, and even better that both performed very well (Tom refereeing the grand final).

NSWRU continues to operate the School Student Scholarship (SSS) program, Sydney Transition Group (mainly school leavers) and Sydney Development Program (mainly 2nd/3rd year referees with NSWRRA with potential to referees at Barraclough Cup level – i.e. Group D). Members of these groups refereed with distinction at the NSWJRU State Championships, SJRU Regional Championships, NSWJRU Sydney v Country, CHS Championships, NSW Schools U18 Trials, NSW Schools U16 Championships, Scots 7s and Rugby AU Junior Gold Cup (U15). We also had a dedicated group of 7s referees who officiated at the Kiama 7s, NSWRU State Age 7s Championships, Western Sydney 7s and Blue Mountains 7s. Thank you to the Referee Coaches who made these tournaments such great development opportunities – Ron Mancell, Richard Manchee, Matt Kellahan, Jamie McGregor, Ian Mooney, James Marshall, David Chapman and Russell Trotter.

Referee reimbursements levels continue to be a concern to NSWRRA members according to the annual survey, with 34% of you disagreeing they are appropriate. In conjunction with your President (Tim Wills) the department juggled with the reimbursement rates to increase them for the first time in some time (10 years?). The general reimbursement for referees was increased from \$25 to \$30 per game, with all AR appointments now reimbursed \$10 (instead of \$0). Referee coaches also saw their reimbursement per report increased from \$10 to \$15 (plus \$5).

per appointment). Given the parlous financial state of NSWRU (and Rugby in general in Australia) this had to be kept budget neutral. This was achieved by reducing the reimbursement for Shute Shield appointments (now \$60 for referees and \$20 for ARs, instead of \$100 and \$40), and by charging schools more for their appointed referees and ARs. This had no impact on the survey satisfaction level. For a year or so a national working group has been reviewing referee reimbursement levels with the intent of recommending a minimum level of reimbursement for all referees. We look forward to the results of that working group, and to any other bright ideas people have on how to reimburse referees for their costs without increasing the financial burden on a struggling game.

With the introduction of our new jersey sponsor (Four and Twenty Pies) and gear provider (Canterbury), everyone received a new issue of jersey, shorts and socks. I believe the collar on this year's jersey was a big improvement on the last, although the shorts were not as good. We are ordering a different short variant for 2019. NSWRU also provided off-field kit (tracksuits, stadium jackets and kit bags) for the first time in 5 years, with interested people being able to purchase at the NSWRU prices (a significant discount from the rack rate). NSWRRA also paid for all referee coaches to be issued a stadium jacket (it's been many years since they received any kit). Hopefully we all look smart, feel comfortable and present as one team!

Team of three communications gear was extended to Colts 1 and Kentwell Cup with NSWRU purchasing another 8 kits. Managing the distribution of 14 kits has become quite a logistic burden, but the benefits to the competition and the officials involved I believe are worth it. Comms gear makes the team of 3 a much better unit as the ARs are now much more aware of what is happening and better able to assist the referee. NSWRRA purchased 18 sets of Sony Bluetooth comms gear (50% paid for by a grant from The Rugby Club Foundation) in order that all Referee Coaches had access to comms gear. Our existing Simultalk comms gear is reaching the end of its life with the number of functional kits remaining falling each year. Comms gear is vital to a Referee Coach performing their role effectively given how important communication is to a referee's performance.

Fitness training was expanded to three nights per week in May, with the intent of increasing accessibility to it. It was run at David Phillips Sports Complex, Forest Rugby Club and TG Millner with three different trainers. The feedback from attendees to all sessions was positive, but attendance was not particularly high. All four Sydney referee associations and NSWRU contributed to the cost of providing this training. We will better promote and refine the model for 2019 to get more of you attending. Please turn up! Not only will your refereeing and general health benefit from being fitter, it's also a great opportunity to socialise with your fellow referees.

Match Official abuse remains the number one issue for referees around Australia. While the definition of abuse was left open to your interpretation, 39% of NSWRRA members reported that they were abused in 2018 (compared to 46% across the state). Only 37% of abused referees reported it (compared to 22% across the state). That suggests that either the abuse was minor, or too many referees are ignoring incidents that should be reported. Rugby AU introduced a national reporting form in 2018 (copying the form NSWRU has used since 2013) to improve access to it. The number of reports submitted was similar to 2017. I also created a Jotform to provide feedback on your match-day experience, with the intent that we could capture both positive and negative experiences, and get more reporting of minor incidents so they could be dealt with before they became a major incident. Take-up of this form was poor. Jamie McGregor and I are looking to trial a new referee satisfaction tracking tool in 2019 (probably not with NSWRRA) with the intent of rolling out nationally in 2020. More work will be done by Rugby AU and NSWRU in 2019 around the education of everyone (particularly coaches and club officials) about the Respect Rugby culture and behavioural expectations.

It would be remiss of me to not to thank the NSW Referee Department staff. Michael Doyle (Senior Manager - Match Officials, Education and 7s Development) is always willing to listen and provide advice. Tom Chadwick came into the Referee Administration Officer role at the start of 2018 and has made a big impression. As a recent school leaver some people may have doubted his experience levels, but we were always confident in his maturity and commitment. Not only has his refereeing improved this year (refereeing the 'final' of the Southern Conference of the Junior Gold Cup amongst other first year NSWRRA experiences), but he has made the role his own. He added two big responsibilities to the role this year – administering incident reports in the Rugby AU system, and appointments for SJRU 7s (and many other 7s tournaments). Our two part-time employees continue to provide excellent service - Stuart Wright managing appointments for the three Sydney district associations and Ron Mancell servicing (mainly) NSW Country referees in development, education and administration.

We would like to acknowledge the efforts of all referees and referee coaches who officiated during 2018. A special thankyou to Daniel Cheever (Premier Appointments), Ian Fraser (Subbies Appointments), the Referee Management Committee (Phil Baird, Daniel Cheever, Anthony Moyes and Ian Smith), Russell Trotter and Cliff Dodds (Coach the Coach), Grading Coordinators (Ian Mooney and Joh Goh), Development Squad coaches (David Chapman, John Goh, Ian Mooney and Greg Whiteley), Finals Group Coordinators (Daniel Cheever, Roger Higgins, Phil Baird, John Goh, myself ©, Ian Mooney and Ian Fraser), and the NSWRRA executive.

In 2018, we enjoyed a high standard of rugby across grade, colts, subbies and schools rugby which enabled our referees to grow and develop their skills.

For our elite referees, there were a number of significant highlights:

- Angus Gardner was once again selected for Six Nations & Rugby Championship appointments and has now cemented his place as one of the top referees in the world.
 We were all thrilled to see Angus win "World Rugby Referee of the Year".
- Will Houston represented us as a Super Rugby referee.
- James Leckie and Ian Smith continued to be appointed as an Assistant Referee and TMO respectively by SANZAR and/or World Rugby.
- Anthony Moyes continued as a referee coach and selector on the World Rugby Sevens Series circuit.

We experienced another great Shute Shield season due to the evenness of the First Grade teams. Our referees facilitated some fantastic contests and the Shute Shield Grand Final pulled a huge crowd at North Sydney Oval for the third year in a row. Congratulations to Sydney Uni on winning another First Grade premiership. Will Houston was appointed to the First Grade Grand Final and made a valuable contribution to the occasion.

Michael Hogan was recognised as the Shute Shield Referee of the Year by winning the Dick Byres Medal. 6 referees – Dru Tonks, Andrew Cox, Brad Smith, Richard Manchee, Ben Wawn and Andrew Coorey made their First Grade debuts in 2018. This has grown our depth of experience at this level and will result in strong competition in 2019.

The Association put on anther enjoyable Annual Dinner in what is the highlight of the referee social calendar. Congratulations to the 2018 Award Winners & those referees who celebrated significant milestones.

A number of our developing referees showed a lot of potential with strong performances in the lower grades and Subbies Rugby. I would particularly like to highlight the strong performances of the Group B referees who performed very strongly in Reserve Grade after recent promotions into this Grade.

Subbies Rugby continues to be a vital component of the rugby landscape in Sydney. Many of the game's biggest fans are those that play and referee in this competition. The rugby is largely incident free due to the spirit of the clubs and the fantastic job that our referees do each and every weekend.

I would like to thank all our referee coaches for the amount of time and effort they put in year in and year out in assisting referees to improve their refereeing performances. 1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The Association is not a reporting entity as defined in Statement of Accounting Concepts SAC 1, Definition of the Reporting Entity, and therefore is not required to prepare financial statements in accordance with Statements of Accounting Concepts and Accounting Standards.
