It was therefore gratifying to see many of our referees getting opportunities at higher levels, particularly Ian Smith and Nathan Pearce, who made their debuts in the Super 14 competition, with Ian also refereeing his first Test match. These gents joined Stuart Dickinson, Matt Goddard and James Leckie as our representatives in this competition "in the middle". We also had several of our senior referees on duty as Assistant Referees, TMOs and "No4 & 5", so NSWRRA had a strong presence, which is fully deserved, and our congratulations go to them all.

The involvement of our referees at representative level provided a host of opportunities for other referees to show their skills at higher levels. It was pleasing to see them grasp their chances and perform extremely well. If carefully handled, this gives depth, builds confidence and provides an incentive for all referees, particularly aspirants.

This association again enjoyed a close relationship with the NSWRU. Its CEO, Jim L'Estrange is sympathetic to our cause. The tireless work done by the NSWRU Referee Department, headed by Ron Mancell, with Jamie McGregor and Robin Timmins lending their expertise, is appreciated by all.

Season 2008 saw the retirement of two esteemed members, Brian Kinsey and George Ayoub, from their respective roles. The outstanding contribution from Brian extends back over many years as a fine Test Referee, then coach, assessor, and administrator. He has been a tower of strength, offering much assistance in many areas. We wish Brian all the very best in his future endeavours, and look forward to seeing him relaxing on the hill at "Rat Park". George, also, has an enviable record as an active referee, having achieved Test status. He will continue as a TMO at IRB level, and will make a fine coach in the future. Special mention should also be made of David "Paddy" Vaughan, who has been an active member of this association for more than half a century – well done, Paddy!

On a sad note, 2008 saw the passing of two of our Life Members, Bruce Estall and Roger Vanderfield. These gentlemen each made enormous contributions to Rugby refereeing, and the game itself. Bruce was a former First Grade referee who later served as Chairman of the Appointments Board. Roger refereed many Test matches and First Grade Grand Finals, and later became Chairman of the International Rugby Board, whilst also making a massive contribution to the medical profession. We send our condolences to the families of these fine gentlemen.

The current Executive has a long-held belief that a healthy social environment is essential for the long-term viability of an association such as ours. It is especially pleasing to note the enthusiasm with which the newer members have embraced this approach, and the manner



in which more established members have accepted the "new kids on the block". There exists strong peer support throughout the association, and there are countless examples of referees shrugging off their own disappointments and appreciating the success of their "competitors". This spirit of camaraderie has been greatly enhanced by the reestablishment of informal gatherings after Education meetings, regular scheduled training sessions, and particularly, coaching groups.

This aspect of our association culminated in the Annual Dinner, held at "Cabana", within Northern Suburbs Rugby Club. It proved to be a fabulous venue. A modified format without a guest speaker allowed a greater emphasis to be placed on our awards and social interaction, and the night was a spectacular success. It was pleasing to see so many members and partners present, across the entire membership spectrum, which again can only enhance the spirit within the NSWRRA.

Your Executive is forever mindful of the need to embrace change where necessary, without compromising the standards and traditions which have been built over more than a century. Whilst this can provide challenges from time to time, it is essential that we remain in touch with our past, and the enormous collective contributions made by our Life Members and others, whilst at the same time, moving forward in time with our great game.

I wish to thank my Executive team of Michael Blair, Phil Baird and Callan O'Neill, whom again, have done an enormous amount of work for this association; much of which goes unnoticed. NSW RUGBY REFEREE DEPARTMENT REPORT

2008 commenced with the introduction of the complete suite of Experimental Law Variations (ELV's) to Premier Rugby $1^{st} - 4^{th}$ grade in March. Generally, the ELV's proved popular with the time for the ball in play increasing and referees having less impact on outcomes due to the lessened number of penalties in matches.

ELV's will be played across all levels of community rugby in 2009, with only slight variations being applied to Under 19 rugby to maintain the higher levels of risk management specific to that form of the game. The ELVs will generate a substantial education program which will delivered to all country and metropolitan prior to the commencement of trial matches in 2009.

The department was able to support NSW Country Rugby Referees annual referee coaching seminar financially and we took the opportunity to participate in the seminar and to deliver a presentation on latest practice referee coaching to the assembled group.

In conjunction with Coach Education we conducted a very substantial suite of courses to service the rugby community throughout 2008. This program started in February and was still very active in July. Courses were delivered mostly on week nights and weekends with a few being delivered on weekdays in certain circumstances. The suite of courses included Foundation (Level 1 Referee), Level 2 Referee, Level 1 & 2 Referee Coach, Level 1 & 2 Touch Judge and Assessor courses.

The Advanced Referee Program (ARP) was delivered to some of the country associations in their home location in 2008. By delivering the ARP in the country associations, we were able to have much better face to face contact with more referees and referee coaches. This ensured that the message penetrated to all levels of the associations involved and it would appear that this is the vehicle for country delivery of the ARP in the future.

In 2008 we extended our education program by conducting four sessions a month in four locations across the city. The same topics were delivered at each location. This allowed referees to choose an education night which best suited their circumstances.

We continued our referee fitness program at E.S. Marks Field throughout the season. This session on Wednesday night is open to all referees in Sydney.

Our referee development programs continued and increased in size and scope again in 2008. With a projected increase to about 100 referees across the referees at different stages of development will receive specialist advice and assistance to improve the quality of their on-field performance.

The department made two notable advances in the IT world which directly impact on referees. Firstly, the Referee Management System was introduced in all Sydney District Associations to facilitate appointments within the basin. The second advance has been to have every referee placed into the Rugby Referee Information Management System (RRIMS). RRIMS is an automated reporting system that better facilitates the sharing of information between referees and referee coaches.

Both country and district associations have embraced the use of communications gear particularly in referee coaching. This has improved the quality of referee coaching across the state.



There have been some notable milestones for some individual referees in 2008. Kate Thompson from Central Coast Rugby Referees Association won the Central Coast Zone Referee of the Year Award. Ian Smith made his test referee debut. James Leckie was appointed as referee to his first Sydney Premier 1st Grade Grand Final and Nathan Pearce won the Dick Byres Award for the best referee in Sydney Premier Rugby.

The NSWRU Referees Department would like to thank MAZDA for their continuing support in 2008 and we look forward to their support in years to come.

We would also like to acknowledge the support of the NSWRRA Executive throughout 2008 and we look forward to working with them and all members of NSWRRA again in 2008.

COACHING AND GRADING PANEL REPORT

My first year in this role was somewhat daunting, being a relative newcomer to the coaching scene. However, the intention was to provide a conduit between coaching and grading in NSW from the lowest levels through to the National (ARU) level. This enabled processes and plans to be implemented, from which it could be more clearly determined which referees had the potential for higher honours. This was seen as being crucial for us to avoid a repeat of the poor representation of this association at RWC 2007.

I am happy to say that this outcome was achieved, with 2008 having been used to give promising referees as many opportunities as possible in which to show their wares. Whilst this opportunity occurs annually with the absence of several of our referees on representative duty, we deliberately undertook to go a little further than we had in previous years. We appointed some of the less experienced, but very talented young referees to games well above those they were used to, and almost without exception, all performed admirably and showed the coaches "where they are at".

This philosophy was consistent throughout all levels under our jurisdiction thanks to an open and transparent appointments policy written by Ron Mancell and the Management Committee, which was published early in the season, and which was adhered to throughout the regular season and the Finals Series.

As a direct consequence, the general mood amongst the referees was extremely positive, as they could see that they would be rewarded, wherever possible, for consistent good performances. This was no more evident than with our 2008 First Grade debutantes in Angus Gardner, Anthony Moyes and Warren Dobes, who are to be congratulated for their achievements in 2008. We hope to continue this approach in 2009 and give opportunities to as many referees as possible.

The process of appointments, grading and coaching does not happen without a mountain of time and effort. I would like to give special mention to Ron Mancell & Robin Timmins from NSWRU, Ian Fraser, Michael Tanzer and Wayne Erickson for their direct assistance to me. It was also very important to have some "wise old heads" around (please excuse the "old" bit), on whom to call for advice, such as Roger Higgins, Andy Bernard, Cliff Dodds & Norm Stevens. Sadly, Grant Campbell has indicated his intention to reduce his workload in 2009. Grant has been instrumental in assisting many referees over the years, especially recently in his role with specific coaching groups.



I was honoured to work with an outstanding group of coaches, all of whom embraced the changes and worked diligently and tirelessly for the betterment of all referees. Whilst we had a few teething troubles, it was this approach, and the clear absence of other agendas which had previously infected the process, that allowed the plans to flow smoothly. That they "got on with the job" is a reflection of those fine gentlemen, and for that I am extremely grateful.

Finally, I wish to thank and acknowledge the massive contribution from Brian Kinsey, who retired from this role at the beginning of 2008. Brian's friendship and help to me this year has been greatly appreciated.

OBITUARY

Dr Roger Vanderfield OBE, AO

It is with great sadness that we learn that Dr Ian Roger Vanderfield OBE, AO passed away on 25 September 2008, aged 80. Ian was a life member of the Association and was the pre-eminent referee of his time and arguably one of, if not our greatest test referee.

Dr Vanderfield had a long and distinguished career with NSW Rugby both on and off the field. Between 1952 and 1976 he refereed more 1260 matches including a representative career that incorporated 14 Tests and 18 other internationals.

His standing in the world game has few peers. He was elected a life member in numerous Rugby bodies from referees to NSW and the ARU.

Dr Vanderfield was the President of the NSWRU and the ARU during the 1980s.

During that time he was instrumental in creating the first Rugby World Cup as Chairman of the International Rugby Board and a member of the RWC organising committee.

Dr Vanderfield will also be missed by the medical community, especially Royal North Shore Hospital, where a building is named in his honour.

In 1976 Dr Vanderfield became an Officer of the Order of the British Empire (OBE) and in 2006 he was appointed Officer of the Order of Australia (AO).

Debut Test Match for Ian Smith

The text of the address reproduced below:

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a special purpose report prepared for the use of the members of the Association

The ffinancial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporated Act 1981 and contains all the disclosure requirements of the following Australian Accounting Standards and other manditory professional requirements:

The financial report has been presented on an accruals basisand is based on historical costs and do not take into account changing money values or, except, where specifically stated, current current valuations of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period, have been adopted in the preparation of these financial statements.

Depreciation

Depreciation is clculated on a straight line basis so as to write off the net of each item of furniture and equipment over its expected life.

Income Tax

The Association is exempt from income tax in accordance with section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act.

Comparative Figures

When required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform to changes in presentation for the current year.

Critical accounting estimates and adjustments
